## **OUTLINE**

This one-day seminar begins with the origins and purpose of evidence-based policing (EBP) within the HIPE framework of modern police practice (harm-focused, intelligence-led, problem-oriented, evidence-based).

The morning session will not only outline what EBP is, but also why it is needed. The case is made by examining a range of different policing strategies and exploring the knowledge within the audience about which tactics work, and their confidence in their estimate.

The afternoon outlines a checklist to undertake a simple study, and then uses policing case studies as examples of how manageable and accessible it is to conduct research within policing. Case studies will likely include the author's research on the Philadelphia Foot Patrol Experiment and an evaluation of Operation Thumbs Down, a gang initiative in South Central Los Angeles. Other possible case studies (to be discussed with the hosts) include research into police-social worker programs to aid the vulnerable community, such as people suffering from involvement with homelessness, opioids, and mental health crisis (as viewed in the Oscar One documentary).

A mix of video, PowerPoint, and audience engagement are used to keep the presentation and momentum going, and links and additional websites are made available to the audience to aid their learning and engagement after the one-day seminar.

## **TARGET AUDIENCE**

Specialisten, analisten, sectorhoofden, teamchefs. This seminar is designed for mid to senior level operational police leaders, and crime/intelligence analysts. Many police services provide new recruits with academy education and senior leaders with executive seminars, but this professional development symposium is designed to develop and engage with mid-level and mid-to-senior level police leadership who so often do much of the work.

## **JERRY RATCLIFFE AND SEBP-NL**

The Society of Evidence Based Policing of The Netherlands, formed by Dutch Police Officers, co-partners this event with Jerry Ratcliffe. Jerry is a former British police officer, college professor, and host of the popular Reducing Crime

podcast. He works with police agencies around the world on crime reduction and criminal intelligence strategy. After an ice-climbing accident ended a decade-long career with London's Metropolitan Police, he earned a first-class honors degree and a PhD from the University of Nottingham. He has published over 100 research articles and nine books, including most recently "Reducing Crime: A Companion for Police Leaders". He has twice received the Professional Service Award from the International Association of Law Enforcement Intelligence Analysts (IALEIA), has been awarded the LEIU Distinguished Service Award, and in 2014 he received the Ronald V. Clarke ECCA award for contributions to environmental criminology and crime analysis. He is a Fellow of both the Academy of Experimental Criminology and the Royal Geographical Society. In 2019 he was awarded the Joan McCord award from the Academy of Experimental Criminology. Ratcliffe has been a research adviser to the FBI and the Philadelphia Police Commissioner, an instructor for the ATF intelligence academy, and he is a member of the FBI Law Enforcement Education and Training Council. He is a professor in the Department of Criminal Justice at Temple University in Philadelphia, USA. Jerry was an officer in the British Army reserves (Royal Engineers), led an expedition down the Selenga river in Siberia, and was the first non-Iban tribesman to successfully navigate (with a traditional carved boat) the rapids of the Temburong river in Borneo. He is an instrument rated seaplane pilot, and also likes to scuba dive, ski, and drink bourbon...just not at the same time.
